MARIA DROSTE COUNSELING CENTER



Based in Denver, Maria Droste Counseling Center collaborates in healing Coloradans struggling with mental health—regardless of their ability to pay.

Maria Droste Counseling Center is a Denver-based nonprofit mental health service organization comprised of mental health professionals, learners and volunteers. Their uniquely sustainable model of traditional and co-located mental health counseling and clinical training is delivered in collaboration with a group of expert private clinicians.

The center trains the next generation of mental health therapists and provides mental health counseling services to Coloradans at the center, via telehealth, and where people live and receive care. They serve individuals of all ages and backgrounds, including children and adolescents, older adults, survivors of domestic violence, and more.



REVEL



Located in Denver, Revel provides teens and adults on the autism spectrum with opportunities that fight potential isolation, depression, unemployment and risk factors related to quality of

Revel believes that teens and adults on the autism spectrum have the ability to connect, work, learn and explore new interests together. The reality is that 40% have had at least one comorbid diagnosed anxiety disorder and 90% are unemployed or underemployed. 1 in 4 are completely isolated, meaning they have not seen or spoken to a friend in the last year.

Revel fights potential isolation, depression, unemployment and risk factors related to quality of life by providing opportunities to develop meaningful relationships, learn independent living skills, explore interests and career paths, engage in a range of fun activities, and participate in recreational outings and events.

DARREN PATTERSON CHRISTIAN ACADEMY
